OCTOBER GARDENING TIPS

- Now is the time to plant or transplant shrubs
- Find good #1 bulbs to plant beneath your pansies or violas. Planting bulbs in containers give a good surprise for the spring.. Pre-chill your bulbs.
- Divide spring blooming perennials. Be a good friend and share your extra plants
- Fall vegetables are in and ready to plant. Collards, kale, cabbage, lettuce are yummy
- Seed and fertilize your lawn, you can also aerate and or dethatch.
- Apply a pre-emergent to kill winter annual weeds. Do not seed until spring if you are applying a pre-emergent
- Bring in your houseplants. Check the leaves for any insects. Clean the leaves with sudsy water and a sponge. If you see bugs – spray with a good triple action spray. This will take care of any insects, mites, or fungus.
